

Decker, Peter, et al. [Letter to Peter R Decker, Esopus, NY]. July 8, 1832.

A remnant of the second cholera pandemic that lasted from 1826 – 1837, this letter marks the downriver passage of disease and rumor through New York's Hudson Valley on the way to Manhattan's first great epidemic and the first major Cholera outbreak in United States history.

Arriving in North America by way of Quebec in June of 1832, the cholera outbreak followed river trade routes down the Saint Lawrence and Hudson, infecting Albany before arriving in New York City. As this letter of early July 1832 from Peter M. Decker of Cobbleskill, New York to his father Peter R. Decker of Esopus, New York (about 80 miles south on the Hudson) demonstrates, it was practically possible to track the disease's southward progress in real time leading to widespread paranoia, as noted in the writer's repeated references to the biblical apocalypse, rumors of cholera in the local canal, and unrest in New York City. (An estimated 120,000 Americans died in the second Cholera pandemic).

Born Margarethe Weissenstein to Jewish parents in Vienna in 1893, the author was the first female graduate from the German Academy for Politics (Deutsche Hochschule für Politik) and wrote her thesis on the rise of Italian fascism in 1931 following her marriage to an Italian engineer. De Francesco wrote for the Frankfurter Zeitung newspaper ahead of the publication of this work in 1937 before fleeing Germany. Captured by the SS in Italy and deported to Ravensbruck Concentration Camp as a political prisoner in 1944, De Francesco died there in February 1945.







Originally launched in Australia in 1963, the London version of Oz was launched in 1967, with both iterations facing prosecution for the violation of obscenity laws. This issue was the first to be published following the raids on the magazine's London offices and the arrest of its editors over the May 1970 "School Kids" issue (#28), which featured a cut-up collage of a pornographic R Crumb cartoon changed to include the Daily Express mascot, Rupert Bear, created by a 15-year-old boy. This would ultimately lead to their prosecution in the editors' highly publicized 1971 trail for obscenity and corrupting public morals, leading to their conviction, imprisonment, and subsequent successful appeal as well as the magazine's collapse in 1973.

This issue contains reference to the unfolding controversy as well as another R Crumb cartoon and an interview with Anais Nin on sex, eroticism and LSD. It also includes a newsprint supplement whose cover promotes Jimi Hendrix's final album A Band of Gypsys, the only live LP released in the artist's lifetime (Hendrix would die in September 1970). Also includes period advertisements for vibrators as well as A Witch Is Born, the 1970 recording of an initiation rite created as a "sign post" by Alexandrian Wicca founder Alex Sanders.

Irish American Senator's Plea to Stay Execution of Easter Rising Plotter Roger Casement

This speech defending Irish nationalist Sir Roger Casement for his role in the Easter Rising of 1916 was given by Irish American Senator James O'Gorman shortly ahead of Casement's execution by British authorities on August 3.

Casement, a human rights activist and journalist who rose to fame and a knighthood documenting Belgian atrocities in the Congo, was radicalized by his experience of Colonialism to join the cause of Irish liberation. Serving as a negotiator with German forces during World War I, Casement arranged for the shipment of German arms to Ireland to support an attempted coup in Dublin aimed for Easter 1916. Ultimately, however, his voyage and the arms were delayed, the Easter Rising failed and its organizers were executed by firing squad. Casement, captured separately, was convicted of treason in a separate trial and sentenced to hang.

Though contemporary opinion was split at the time of the Easter Rising, support grew within Ireland after its brutal suppression. This is presciently echoed in Senator O'Gorman's speech wherein he compares Casement and his compatriots to Nathan Hale and other patriots of the American Revolution.



A project of Joseph Pulitzer — publisher of the New York World, rival of William Randolph Hearst, and author of the introduction — this almanac and encyclopedia serves as a fascinating relic from his printing empire and the role both he and Hearst played in the rush to war with Spain and the start of American Imperialism. Based on the inclusion of the second supplement, it appears that this edition of Pulitzer 's almanac had been further updated in the summer ahead of the Spanish American war 's end that August. Further, the well preserved wraps date from only two years after the introduction of the World's four-color printing press.

In addition to the war supplements, the text contains numerous ads for contemporary companies and services — including Old Crow Rye and a Brooklyn rehabilitation clinic for "the opium habit" — as well as information on missionary and temperance societies, Freemasonry, and veterans groups from the Civil War and War of 1812. Also includes reports on the size and capabilities of European armed forces and weaponry as well as other statistics noted as relevant to the war on the front wrap. Of local historical interest, there are numerous contemporary street maps of Manhattan and Brooklyn including maps of now defunct elevated rail and street car lines, as well as information about the contemporary fare rates for New York cabs.



Education Of A French Model Kiki's Memoirs 1962

Alice Prin, better known as Kiki de Montparnasse, was a model and artist's muse in Paris most commonly associated with the avant garde art scene of the interwar years. A nude model for artists starting at the age of 14, Kiki's most famous image is likely Man Ray's photograph Violin D'Ingres. This text, the story of her rise to prominence originally published as Kiki's Memoirs in 1928 and translated in English by Samuel Putnam in 1930 with a foreword by Ernest Hemingway calling it the best recollection of the spirit of Jazz Age, Paris he could find (he would later try his own hand in revisiting the same period in his memoir, A Moveable Feast).

Declared obscene in the United States and banned (and therefore out of copyright), New York bookseller and publisher Samuel Roth began publishing various pirated editions without the author's name (or any offer of royalties) as he had with other texts like James Joyce's Ulysses and D.H. Lawrence's Lady Chatterley's Lover. (Roth was also the unsuccessful defendant in the 1957 Supreme Court Case Roth vs. The United States, which ruled he could not sell the "obscene" magazine American Aphrodite through the mail). Unique to Roth's editions of Kiki's Memoirs (sold under the title "The Education of a French Model") are the additional later chapters describing Kiki discovering her book's fame and travelling to New York to meet with "that archpirate" Samuel Roth and reunite with Ernest "Papa" Hemingway 23 years after the close of the original narrative. The prominence of Hemingway's placement on the cover and in the story are almost undoubtedly connected

to his suicide in Ketchum, Idaho in late 1961. (The same year as this publication, Roth followed the suicide of Marilyn Monroe with a controversial tell-all supposedly written by her psychiatrist).

Written at the promising start of Delmore Schwartz's career, this translation of A Season in Hell by Arthur Rimbaud marked the first appearance of the full poem series in book form in the United States. The first partial English translation appeared as an excerpt in The Dial in 1920 but in addition to its incompleteness, Schwartz suspected his own effort to bring Rimbaud to an anglophone audience would be more accurate. Printed in both English and French on opposing pages this wonderfully bound edition marks one of the early publications from New Directions during its first decade of operation. Founded by poet, publisher and editor James

Limited, First Separately Published English Edition 1 out of 780 Laughlin while he was still a student at Harvard, the still extant company was originally housed in his dorm room and a barn on his aunt's estate in Norfolk (where this book was printed) before opening its offices in New York city. Delmore Schwartz also appeared in Laughlin's third edition of the New Directions in Poetry and Prose anthology also published by New Directions in 1938.

An issue of the eponymously titled newsletter from the anti-war, anti-imperialist organization, RESIST founded in Boston in 1966 by members including Noam Chomsky among others. The subsequent publication of the collective's "A Call To Resist Illegitimate Authority" in 1967, signed by Allen Ginsberg, Mitchell Goodman, and Norman Mailer helped lead to that year's March on the Pentagon in protest of the Vietnam War as well as the subsequent prosecution of the "Boston Five", all members of RESIST, for aiding draft avoidance.

This issue includes coverage of the progress of RESIST grantees the Labor-Community Alliance of Hawaii and the Somerville Women's Health Project as well as a jail house profile of Rafael "Fafa" Taveras of the Marxist-Leninist Dominican Popular Movement (MPD) following his imprisonment for his purported role in the 1970 kidnapping of US Air Force Colonel Donald Crowley, originally published in the Tricontinental News Service.

Second English language edition of the influential French erotic novel "Prelude Charnel" with reworked opening following of the 1938 first English translation also published by Vendome Press. Originally published in 1934, this book is an unusual matrimonial erotic fantasy of delayed gratification focused on the courtship and seduction of a newlywed husband and wife.

Inspired in part by the real relationship of its author Robert Denoel, who published the book under the penname Sermaise, the truth of his authorship emerged after his death when his wife sued for the rights to royalties and produced the original manuscript. The controversial co-founder of Editions Denoel, the originally Belgian Robert Denoel was accused of collaboration with the German occupiers and Vichy government in France, though this book proved enormously popular during the war due to the number of couples undergoing prolonged separation. Denoel was assassinated while changing the tire on his car in Paris shortly after liberation in 1945.

This edition from the first English translations produced by Vendome Press represents another unstated pornographic collaboration between Jack Kahane of Obelisk Press and his on again off again printer Marcel Servant. Co-owner of the Lecram-Servant Printer, Servant helped operate Kahane's offlabel "Vendome Press" from 338 Rue Saint Honore utilizing the printing presses originally acquired by the English ex-pat Herbert Clarke through to Kahane's death in the fall of 1939. No translator is given, though significant changes are evident from the first 1938 translation to the text found here. It's possible that this may represent an original translation from Kahane, though, as Miers and Early 20th Century Smut Interesting Publisher Armstrong's 2011 bibliographic history Of Daffodils and Obelisks put it, Servant and his printing partner M. Lecram are two of the "many mysteries surrounding the Obelisk Press".

A noted publisher of controversial literature as well as erotic material, Jack Kahane 's other publications from Obelisk Press and Vendome Press included his own Daffodils under the penname "Cecil Barr" and some of the earliest books by Henry Miller. An associate of Sylvia Beach of Shakespeare and Company, Kahane was disappointed not to have picked up Joyce's Ulysses when he had a chance and would later go on to inspire the Olympic Press. This copy, attractively rebound from its wraps into contemporary half leather marbled boards, was purchased and preserved by an early discriminating collector as seen in other the few other surviving, highly collectible rebound copies of Vendome and Obelisk books.



was allowed to purchase the building for \$1 and have it moved to another location where he continued to live and work through the end of his life in August 2022, teaching "electromagnetic kung fu" and transforming the house into the noted folk art "Cosmic Moose and Grizzly Bear's Ville".
